"Open"

La galería Álvaro Alcázar presenta la exposición monográfica del artista moscovita Andrei Roiter (1960), una muestra que alberga cerca de una veintena de obras, realizadas en los últimos años, que comprenden pinturas y una escultura. Tras doce años de su exposición en la Galería Fúcares, el artista regresa a Madrid con una gran exposición que podrá visitarse hasta mediados de enero de 2024 en la galería Álvaro Alcázar.

La obra de Andrei Roiter es un compendio de toda una serie de vivencias y experiencias personales que se remontan a su juventud -marcada por el totalitarismo soviético- y se extienden hasta el actual clima político global. Cuestiones como la emigración, el exilio voluntario y la búsqueda de la propia identidad, están presentes en el repertorio iconográfico del artista, bien de forma explícita o como referencia simbólica. Así, uno de los elementos que Roiter más repite es el cuadrado con el círculo en el centro, como en *Opening #2*, *#3* o *#4*, donde el artista nos habla de apertura y huida. Una de sus obras favoritas de su viejo amigo, Ilya Kabakov, es "Man Who Flew into Space from His Apartment" (*El hombre que voló al espacio desde su apartamento*), la instalación que incluye un agujero en el techo de un apartamento por el que el ocupante se eyectó al espacio. Roiter se relaciona autobiográficamente con la obra, ya que él mismo huyó de Rusia a finales de los 80. Roiter también se inspira en otros artistas que interactúan con los límites espaciales, como Lucio Fontana o Gordon Matta-Clark, quién utilizaba edificios vacíos como medio para abrir enormes agujeros en sus fachadas, dejando vacío en su interior. En el caso de Roiter, sus rupturas iluminan un espacio oculto y metafísico tras el lienzo.

Las cajas de cartón o de mudanza (Yellow Tower, Spire) son también constantes en su obra, formando a veces burdas maquetas de edificios que parodian grandes torres empíricas como el Empire State Building o el Kremlin. La arquitectura es precisamente otro de sus temas más reiterados (Ivory Tower), pues hay que recordar que se formó durante algunos años en esta disciplina.

Desde una perspectiva formal, la obra de Roiter se caracteriza principalmente por su dominio técnico y por la austeridad que envuelve las formas y la paleta, limitándose prácticamente a verdes, sepias, rojos y pardos. En general son colores oscuros y apagados, bajo los que subyace la melancolía del artista y donde sin embargo, persiste la presencia de una delicada luminosidad.

Los pensamientos y sentimientos que Andrei Roiter desnuda en esta exposición, según él mismo ha señalado, representan experiencias universales complejas como la soledad, la falta de fundamento y la fragilidad. Los objetos de sus cuadros son retratos simbólicos y metafóricos de aspectos humanos, brillantemente ejecutados.







"Open"

On November 16th, Alvaro Alcazar Gallery presents the solo exhibition of the Moscow-born artist Andrei Roiter (1960), a show that features around twenty works made in the last few years, including paintings, and a sculpture. After twelve years of his solo exhibition at the Fúcares Gallery, the artist returns to Madrid with a major exhibition that will be on view until mid-January 2024 at Álvaro Alcázar Gallery.


Andrei Roiter's work is a compilation of a whole series of personal experiences, starting from his youth -marked by Soviet totalitarianism- and spanning to the present global political climate. Issues such as emigration, voluntary exile, and a search for self identity, are present in the artist's iconographic repertoire, either explicitly or as a symbolic reference. Thus, one of the elements that Roiter repeats the most is the square with the circle in the center, as in Opening #2, #3 or #4, where the artist is speaking to us of openness and escape. One of his favorite works of his old friend, Ilya Kabakov, is "Man Who Flew into Space from His Apartment", the installation piece that includes a hole in the ceiling of an apartment through which the occupant ejected himself into space. Roiter relates autobiographically to the work, as he himself fled Russia at the end of the 80's.

Roiter is also inspired by other artists who interact with spacial boundaries, such as Lucio Fontana and Gordon Matta-Clark who used empty buildings as a medium to open huge holes in their facades, leaving the emptiness inside. In Roiter's case, his ruptures illuminate a hidden, metaphysical space behind the canvas..

Cardboard or moving boxes (Yellow Tower, Spire) are also constant in his work, sometimes forming crude models of buildings parodying grand, empirical towers such as the Empire State Building and the Kremlin. Architecture is precisely another of his most reiterated themes (Ivory Tower), as we must remember that he trained for some years in this discipline.

From a formal perspective, Andrei Roiter's work is characterized mainly by his technical mastery and by the austerity that surrounds the forms and the palette, practically limited to greens, sepia, reds and browns. They are generally dark, muted colors, under which underlies the melancholy of the artist. Yet, there's a persistent presence of a delicate luminosity.

The thoughts and feelings Andrei Roiter lays bare in this exhibition, he has pointed out, represent complex universal experiences such as solitude, groundlessness and fragility. The objects in his paintings are symbolic and metaphorical portraits of human aspects, brilliantly executed.





ANDREI ROITER

Moscú, Rusia, 1962

Nacido en el seno de la Unión Soviética, sus padres se conocieron en un Gulag en Siberia, yendo a visitar a sus respectivos padres. Con 14 años Roiter manifestó su vocación por la pintura, algo que no fue del agrado de sus padres, que le instaron a dedicarse a algo "normal". En 1978 Roiter se matriculó en Arquitectura y mientras pintaba en la clandestinidad, pasó por trabajos en Correos, en una librería y finalmente en una guardería abandonada, como vigilante de seguridad nocturno.

Esto último fue fundamental para su carrera como artista, pues junto a otros artistas como Nikolai Filatov y Herman Vinogradov, crearon el grupo Kindergarten, que fue durante un tiempo el centro del mundo de los artistas moscovitas, utilizando, el edificio abandonado que custodiaban, para centro de arte.

Así, hasta los 28 años Roiter vivió en Moscú trabajando discretamente en la pintura, hasta que el gobierno aperturista de Gorbachov hizo posible que el artista saliera de Rusia por primera vez en 1988, para acudir a una exposición en Bruselas. Un visado de 3 meses, fue el pistoletazo de salida para la nueva vida del artista, quién abandonó definitivamente Moscú para instalarse en Amsterdam, donde a día de hoy mantiene su estudio, junto con Nueva York, ciudad natal de su esposa.

Siempre que Roiter visita su Rusia natal, como él mismo señala, se siente extraño en Moscú, al igual que en Amsterdam o Nueva York, donde tiene la sensación de no pertenecer a ningún lugar. Su destino es ser un extranjero permanente y es esta idea la que impregna toda su obra.



ANDREI ROITER

Moscow, Russia, 1962

Born in the heart of the Soviet Union, his parents met in a Gulag in Siberia, while visiting their respective parents. With 14 years Roiter expressed his vocation for painting, something that his parents did not like and encouraged him to devote himself to something "normal".

In 1978 Roiter enrolled in Architecture and while painting in the underground, he worked at the Post Office, in a bookstore and finally in an abandoned kindergarten, as a night security guard.

The latter was fundamental for his career as an artist, because together with other artists such as Nikolai Filatov and Herman Vinogradov, they created the Kindergarten group, which was for a time the center of the Moscow artists' world, using the abandoned building they guarded as an art center. Thus, until he was 28 years old, Roiter lived in Moscow, working secretly in painting, until Gorbachev's open-minded government made it possible for the artist to leave Russia for the first time in 1988, to attend an exhibition in Brussels.

A three-month visa was the starting point for the new life of the artist, who left Moscow definitely to settle in Amsterdam, where today he maintains his studio, along with New York, his wife's hometown. Whenever Roiter visits his native Russia, as he himself points out, he feels strange in Moscow, just as he does in Amsterdam or New York, where he has a feeling of not belonging to any place. His destiny is to be a permanent stranger, and it is this idea that permeates all his work.
